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**Final Recommendations Presented for Public Input**

**Cincinnati, OH --** The Western Hamilton County Transportation Study will host its third and final public meeting on Wednesday, September 27<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. in the Theatre Building on the campus of the College of Mount Saint Joseph, 5701 Delhi Road. The main purpose of the open house style meeting is to share the collection of conceptual transportation improvements with the public for their comment.

“The main focus of the Western Hamilton County Transportation Study is to improve mobility and safety on the area’s roadways,” said Warren Strunk, Crosby Township Trustee and member of the study’s Oversight Team and Advisory Committee. “In order to accomplish this, we took a good, hard look at what can be done to improve the transportation network and have over 99 recommendations ready for public input.”

The recommendations presented will be in conceptual planning form and will not be the final, engineered improvements.

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**Western Study Public Meeting**  
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Increasing development in Western Hamilton County has caused many roadways to be operating at or close to capacity. In response, the Ohio-Kentucky-Indiana Regional Council of Governments (OKI) has initiated a major transportation study of the area. The study is investigating potential improvements to the overall traffic flow to improve mobility and safety.

The study covers the western roadways in Hamilton County Ohio including major roadways and the western suburbs of the City of Cincinnati. It stretches from the Indiana state line on the west and Butler County Ohio to the north. Major roadways being investigated are U.S. 27 and 50; State Route 126, 128 and 264; as well as I-74 and I-275.
